History is often perceived as "old" stuff, be it an artifact, antique or even a person. It is generally understood that something must be at least 50 years old to be an antique. Even a property must be over 50 years old to be considered for the National Register. It therefore makes perfect sense that in order to be historical and "old", the item in question must be 50 years young.

For those of us who are fast approaching the age of 50 or are already past that milestone, I would like to point out that history is just like the river in the quote by Heraclitus. It is ongoing, today is tomorrow's history.

History can be explained like an old joke. A wife

Now Available in the CCHS Library Lester Prairie Newspapers on Microfilm

The Carver County Historical Society has recently added to its collection of newspapers on microfilm. The additions to our collection include the Lester Prairie Journal for April 30, 1897 – January 7, 1901 and December 4, 1980 – October 28, 1991 and the Lester Prairie News for June 14, 1901 – November 20, 1980. In all, this acquisition added fifty-four rolls of microfilm to our library. This project has been financed in part with funds provided by the State of Minnesota through the Minnesota Historical Society's Grants-in-Aid Program. The remainder has been financed through donations to the Carver County Historical Society library.







Barns of Carver County Exhibit Members Only Grand Opening December 1, 5:00-7:00 PM



CCHS bids a fond farewell to Bill Mihelich



William Mihelich, 83, of Victoria, died Monday, Oct. 6, 2008.

Born March 5, 1925 and raised in Chisholm, he served with the 17th Airborne Division as a paratrooper during World War II. Captured during the Battle of the Bulge, he spent the last four months of the war at Stalag 4-B prison camp near the Elb River in Germany.

Liberated by the Russians, Corporal Mihelich was discharged from service and married his high school sweetheart, Josephine (Jo) Radosevich in 1945. He worked as a crushing plant operator for the Oliver Iron Mining Company before being hired as a conservation officer for the State of Minnesota. In charge of Carver County, he was stationed in Waconia from 1962 until his retirement on May 1, 1994.

His parents and siblings preceded him in death while his survivors include wife, Jo, of Victoria; daughter, Susan Krech of Waconia; granddaughters, Amy Krech of Madison, S.D., Holly Krech Thomas of New York City, N.Y.; great-grandchildren, Nathaniel and Hannah Thomas; nieces and nephews.

Private burial services were held at Fort Snelling National Cemetery. Memorials are preferred to CCHS designated for the Andrew Peterson Farm. Bill and his wife Jo were instrumental in getting both Coney Island in Waconia and the Peterson Farm listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The "Last Man"

Last October, John Kuenzel brought in a bit of history commemorating World War I veterans from Watertown.


The 75mm artillery shell, engraved with the names of the 48member "Last Man's Club" of Watertown, contained a bottle of wine and newspapers from the time it was sealed in 1942. In 1986 John's father, Fred Kuenzel, outlived Tony Kaiser to become the last surviving WW I veteran from Watertown. With family and friends at his side, Fred opened the shell and drank a toast to his departed comrades.

Our Veteran's Gallery is slated for redevelopment in 2009. We are looking for stories like the one above to put a local face on the new exhibit. In the more than 150 years of its existence, Carver County has played an active role in many wars.
