As the quality of healthcare and nutrition increases, people are living much longer and healthier lives. Death is no longer the daily fear, the constant reminder of how short life can be. We visit cemeteries occasionally and as a result, they have the reputation of being spooky, creepy, or reminders of what we seek to ignore.

Not too long ago, death was a much more dominating factor in daily life. Infant mortality was high, diseases rampant, and healthcare poor. People accepted death as inevitable as birth. Services for the dead were held in the home and families tended to family grave sites, occasionally turning the visit into a family outing, maybe including a picnic.

Elaborate mourning rituals were the norm. Rituals included wearing mourning clothing and elaborate flowers, funeral processions, mourning period lengths, how and when to call on the deceased's relatives, and more.

Visit the Carver County Historical Society for a look back into the customs of death and dying throughout Carver County. Learn about plagues and disease outbreaks, infant mortality, funerals in the home, the first Carver County undertaker, funeral business, and so much more! The display features mourning clothing, funerary photographs, newspaper clippings and other collections pieces.




