

The Willkommen Heritage and Preservation Society of Norwood Young America is taking on the task of researching the Country Schools that were "feeders" to ISD #108. It was discovered that there were

eighteen (18) country schools within the current boundaries of ISD #108.

A group of dedicated volunteers have each taken two or three schools to research. They are looking for items such as: when did the school close, who was the teacher, does the school still exist, are there any pictures of the school, has it been converted into something else, and are there any artifacts in existence?

Some interesting facts that have been discovered are that some schools were moved and are now private homes, and some still exist at their original location. Some of the schools held classes for grades 1-6, and others held classes for 1-8. Some students left District 26-now a private home go to a Parochial school to get Confirmed, and then returned. We can't seem to find out



Kindergarten was held, so if anyone can help with that question, it would be greatly appreciated. Our goal is to find as many past students as possible, with the hope that they will be willing to share their memories.
