## Smithsonian Institution, “Journey Stories” comes to the Carver County Historical Society

December 11, 2010-January 22, 2011, the Carver County Historical Society will host a new exhibit titled *Journey Stories*. Part of the Smithsonian Institution's Museum on Main Street exhibits, *Journey Stories* focuses on tales of how we and our ancestors came to America. From Native Americans to new American citizens and regardless of our ethnic or racial , everyone has a story to tell. The *Journey Stories* exhibit is filled with stories of people leaving behind everything – families and possessions – to reach a new life in another state, across the continent, or even across an ocean.

The CCHS is one of only five locations in Minnesota chosen to host this exhibit. In coming months, watch for a plethora of information and events in conjunction with this program. Teacher lesson plans are available from the Smithsonian Institution web site for this event.

The opening of the redesigned Veterans Gallery has been a dream for ten years. Its redesign could not have been accomplished without the help of many, many volunteers and donors. While we still have approximately \$10,000 to raise, it should be noted that we are thankful for every donation. People contributed as they were able. One twenty dollar donation arrived with a note stating that was all the donor could afford and they wished it could be more. The gallery is a tribute to our Carver County veterans. We had hoped to make it theirs and so it is. One person deserves a special thank you, Dan Steinhagen.

This summer we bid adieu to Erin Anderson, our Education Coordinator. After a long search, Kyle Tredinnick was hired to replace Erin. Kyle is a new Education graduate from St. Cloud State University. Due to budget cuts, we could only offer him 30 hours per week but with the new Legacy grant opportunities it is hoped that we will be able to bring his hours up to 40.

In September of 2008, Minnesota voters passed the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment. With a portion of these funds, the state legislature created the Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund which is designated for history-related projects around the state. These Cultural Grants programs are seeded by a pool of \$6.75 million to be awarded in the 2010-11 biennium for "projects of enduring value for the cause of history and historic preservation." With the beginning of 2010, we say a sad goodbye to nine year board member Val Barlau who has reached her term limit. Val has been instrumental in all aspects of the CCHS. ## **The Minnesota Historical Society Awards Carver County Historical Society—A Historical and Cultural Heritage Grant**

Without a concerted effort, our state's historical and cultural treasures are in danger of being lost to time. The Minnesota Historical Society awarded a Minnesota Historical and Cultural Heritage Grant in the amount of \$5800 to the Carver County Historical Society. The grant was approved by the Society's awards committee on January 4, 2010 and will support its Veterans Collection Storage Area Furnishings.

Minnesota Historical and Cultural Heritage Grants are made possible by the Minnesota Legislature from the Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund created with passage of the Clean Water, Land and Legacy Amendment to the Minnesota Constitution in November 2008. The grants are awarded to support projects of enduring value for the cause of history and historic preservation across the state.

### **Veterans Collections Storage Area Furnishings**

The Veterans Collections Storage Area Furnishings is a project of enduring value because it will create a safe, secure storage area for military collections, particularly firearms and improve the organization of and accessibility to firearms and military collections. The project begins on March 1, 2010, with an anticipated completion date of October 1, 2010. The project will include storage furniture for a new military collections storage area, including two custom cabinets for firearms and edged armament, three custom wardrobes for military uniforms, and five shelving units for 3D artifacts. This storage area will house military artifacts not exhibited in the museum's new Veterans Gallery, improve security for the firearm collection and, by moving firearms and military collections from other storage areas, create much-needed additional space for general collections.

"It is wonderful to see so many communities and local organizations benefitting from the Historical and Cultural Heritage Grants," said Britta Bloomberg, deputy state historic preservation officer. "Minnesotans should be proud of the unprecedented opportunities these grants provide for organizations to preserve and share our history and cultural heritage. The impact of projects supported by Historical and Cultural Heritage Grants will be felt throughout the state for many years to come."

### **CCHS Seeks Funding for Veterans' Gallery**

Although the remodeling of the Veterans Gallery is almost done, we are still in need of donations to complete the project. It is estimated that gallery construction will cost approximately \$18,000. CCHS is looking for donors to sponsor portions of the display. Donors may choose which section they wish to sponsor and a plaque denoting sponsorship will be placed in the gallery upon its completion. 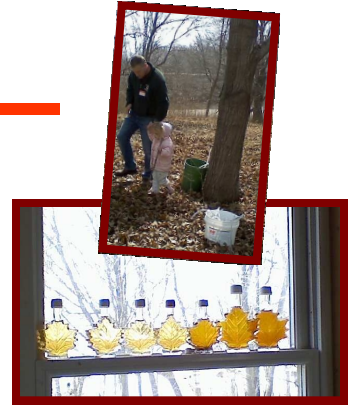
### COMING EVENTS
